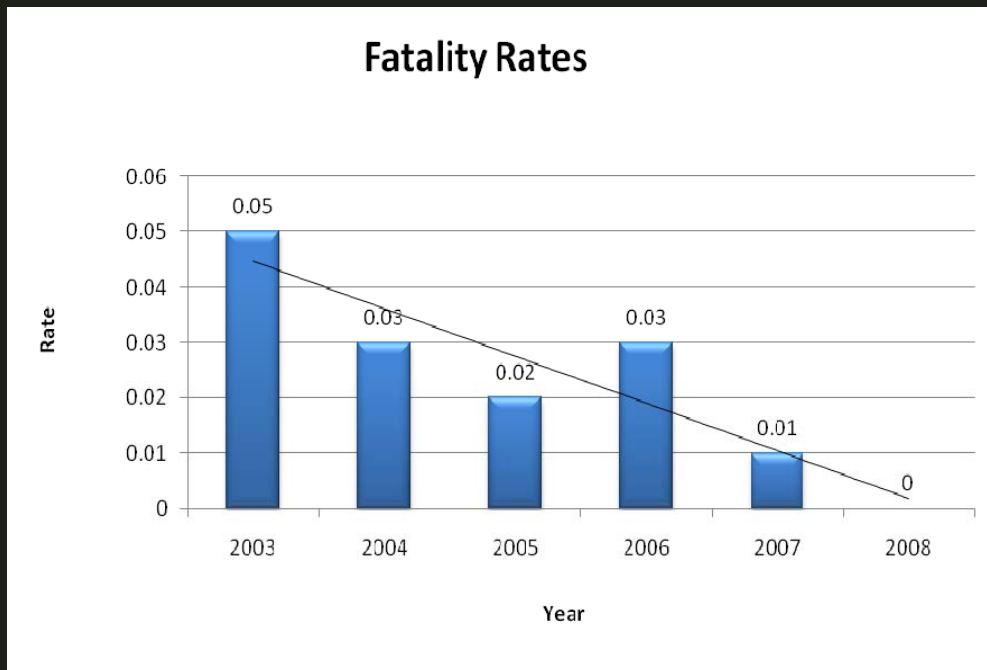
AWO TRENDS 2003-2008

2008 NUMBERS REFLECT ONLY THROUGH Q3

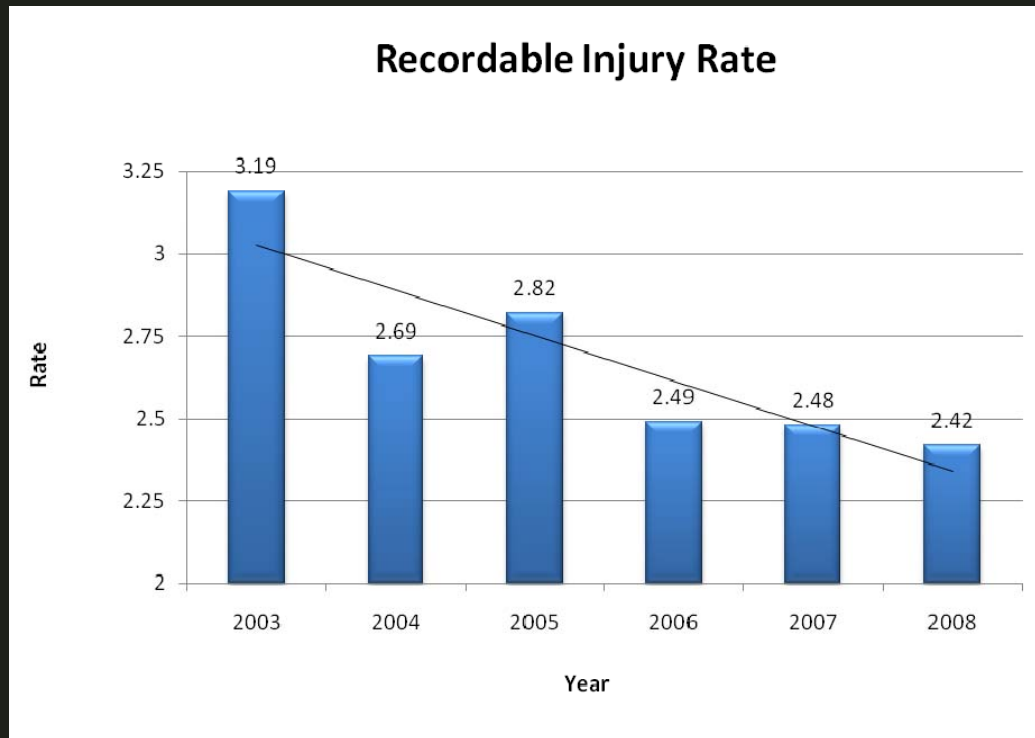


Fatalities

- One fatality in 2008



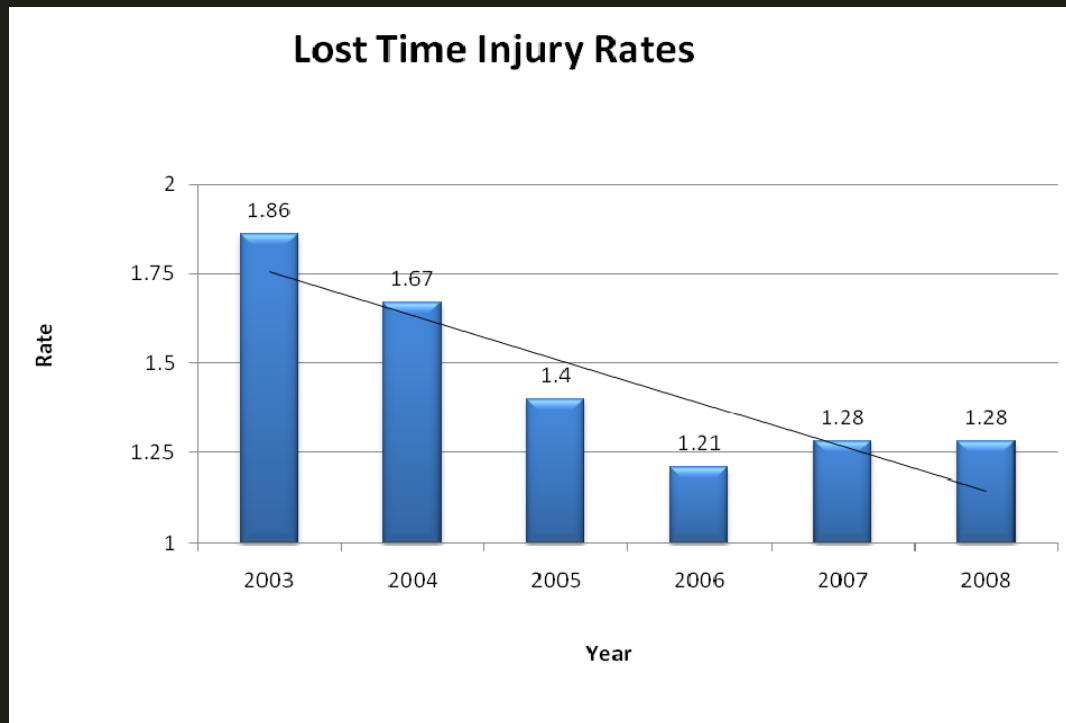
Recordable Injuries

- 2008 was slightly above trend



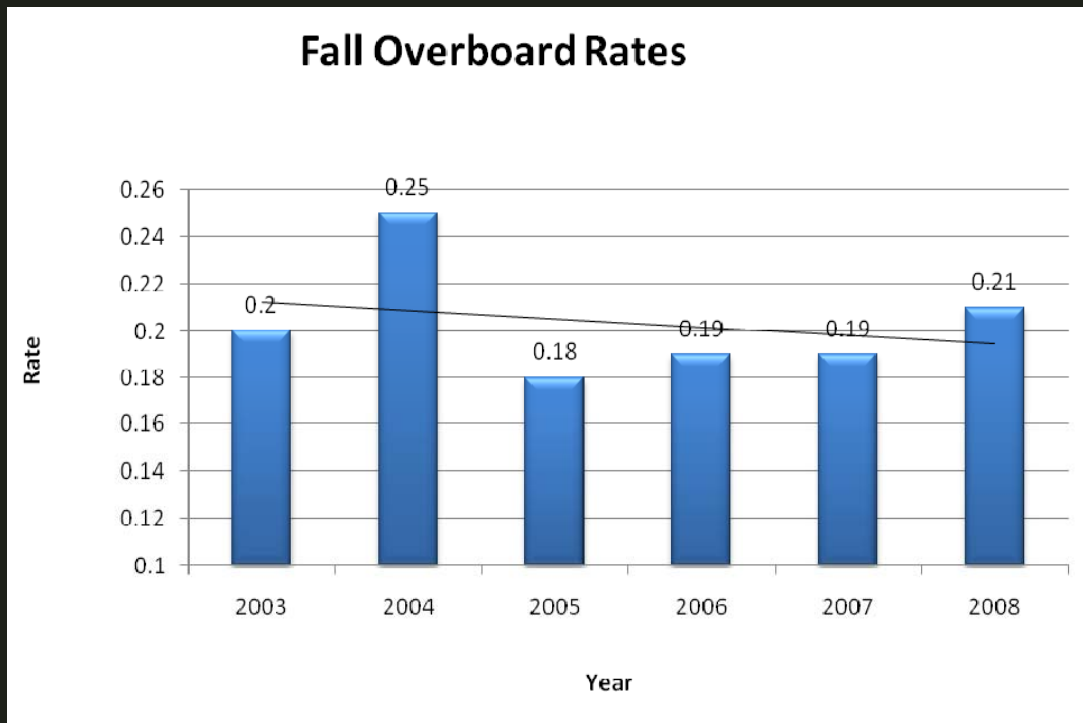
Lost Time Injuries

Falls Overboard

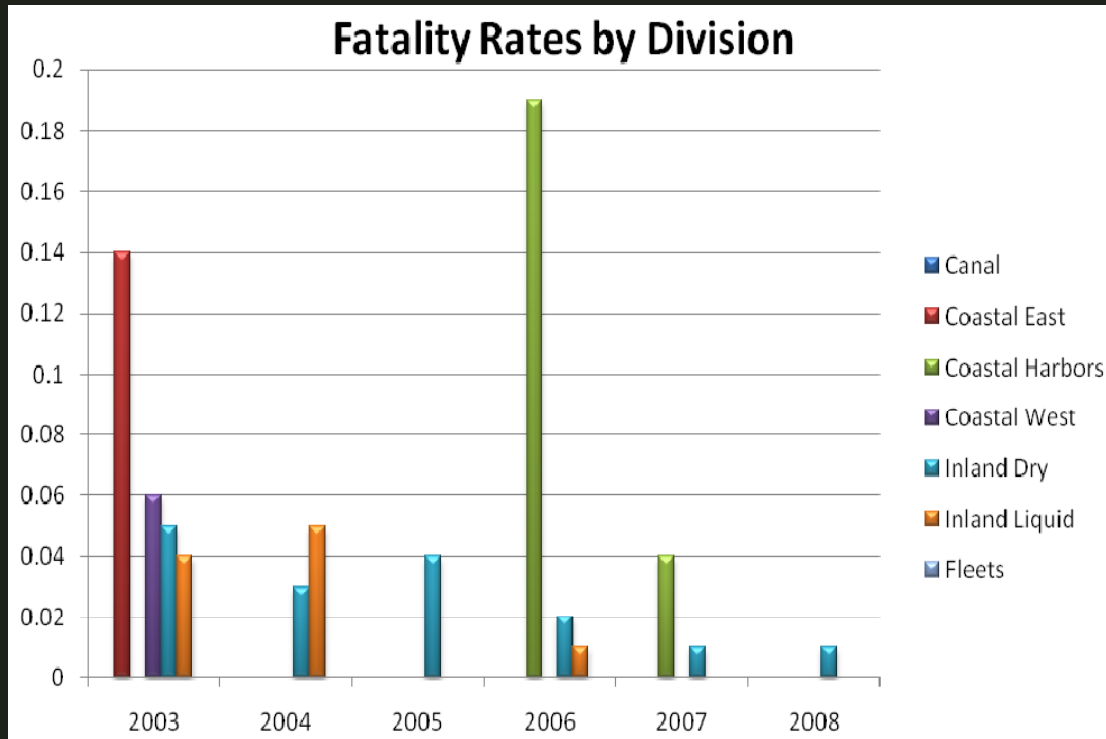


- This is the area of least progress
- More needs to be done here

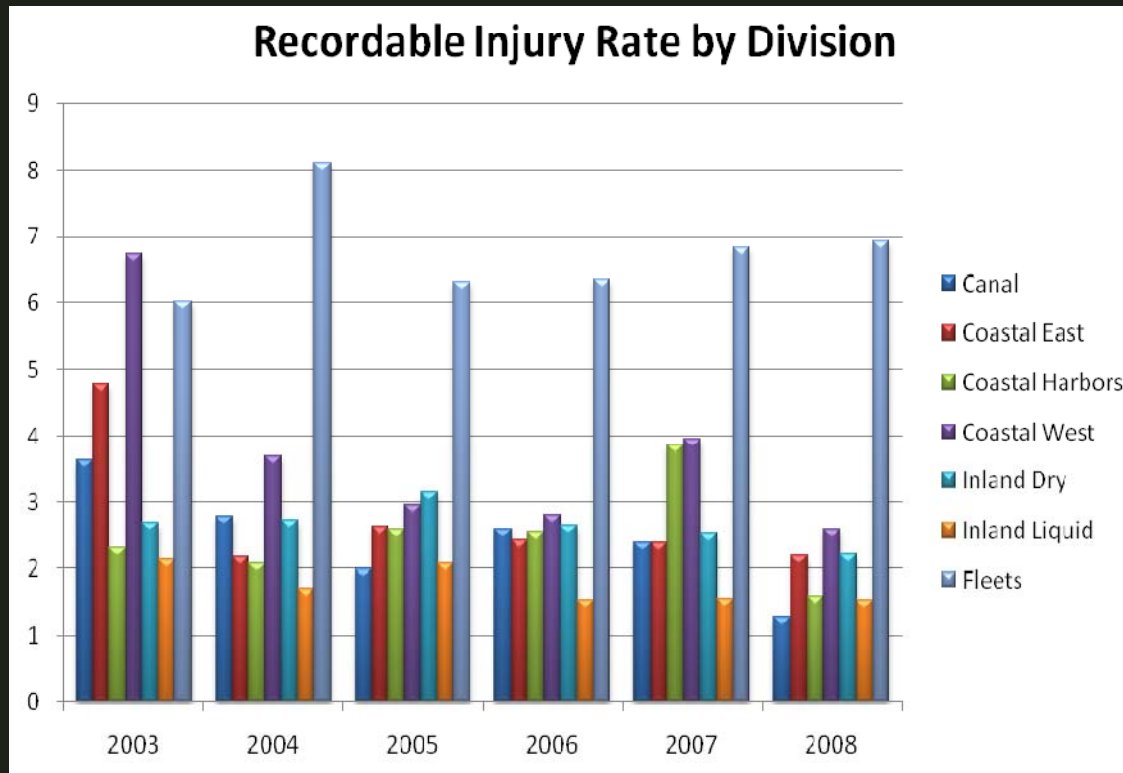


Fatalities by Division

- Fleets are a consistent contributor



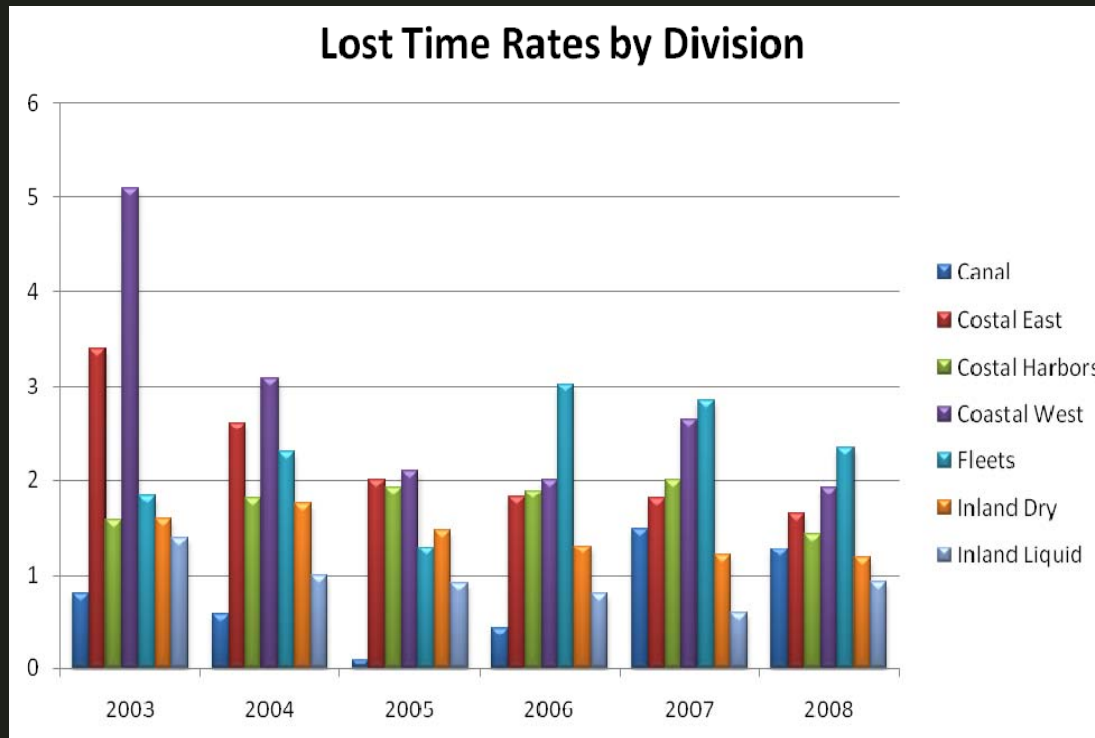
Recordable Injuries by Division



- Fleets are a strong lead in this section



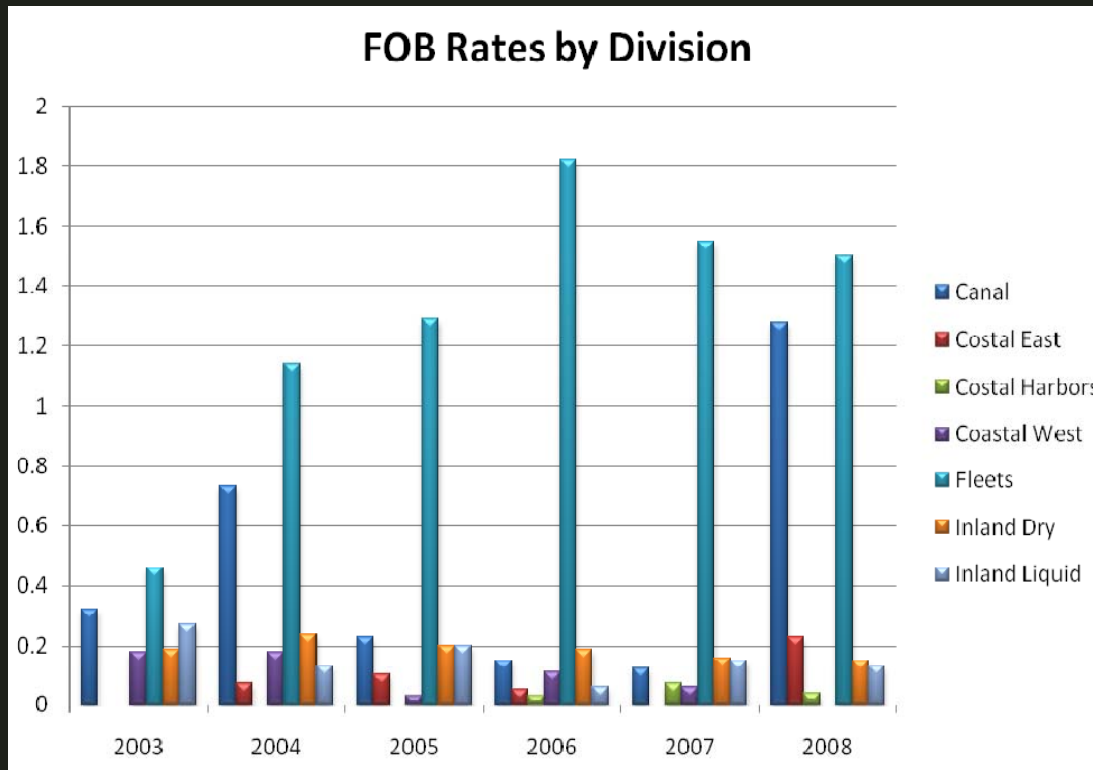
Lost Time Injuries by Division
