The American Waterways Operators (AWO) is the tugboat, towboat and barge industry's advocate, resource, and united voice for safe, sustainable and efficient transportation on America's waterways, oceans, and coasts. Our industry is the largest segment of the nation's 40,000-vessel domestic maritime fleet and moves 665 million tons of cargo each year safely and efficiently. On behalf of AWO's more than 300 member companies, we appreciate the opportunity to comment on the Draft Programmatic Environmental Impact Statement (PEIS) for the expansion and modernization of Base Seattle.

AWO supports the expansion and modernization of the Coast Guard's Base Seattle, given its importance to maritime operations in Seattle, the state of Washington, and throughout the West Coast. The Coast Guard's presence on the Pacific Coast must be modernized to provide for a high level of safety, protect the environment, and ensure national security.

The PEIS describes the need for additional pier space to accommodate Coast Guard vessels and increase operational technology at the Base. With these advances, the state's \$38 billion maritime industry as well as the city of Seattle and the state of Washington will benefit from the Coast Guard's expansion and modernization, with increased safety, security, and economic benefits.

There are many factors that make Seattle an ideal location for an updated and improved Coast Guard base. Seattle is Washington state's largest city and serves as important economic driver
